During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, the Texas Board of Nursing (Board) finds that an C. of the Board was mistakenly ratified for Jennifer Leigh Pliler. Page 1 of the Order contains an incorrect license number. Upon notice and hearing, administrative agencies, like the Courts, have the power to enter nunc pro tunc orders where it can be seen by reference to a record that what was intended to be entered, but was omitted by inadvertence or mistake, can be corrected upon satisfactory proof of its rendition provided that no intervening rights will be prejudiced. *Railroad Comm'n v. McClain*, 356 S.W.2d 330, 334 (Tex. App.--Austin 1962, no writ) (citing *Frankfort Ky. Nat. Gas Co. v. City of Frankfort*, 276 Ky. 199, 123 S.W.2d 270, 272).

The Executive Director, as agent of the Texas Board of Nursing, after review and due consideration of the record and the facts therein, invalidates the Order of the Board for Jennifer Leigh Pliler that was mistakenly ratified on September 14, 2010, and submits and enters the corrected Order of the Board, with the effective date of September 14, 2010. The corrected Order correctly reflects Ms. Pliler's license number on page 1 of the Order. No other changes to the Order have been made. Ms. Pliler received due process regarding her nursing license; therefore, her rights have not been prejudiced.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the corrected Order of the Board is hereby approved and entered on the dates set forth below.

During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on September 14, 2010, the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case. This case was heard, and based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing (22 TEX. ADMIN.CODE § 213.2(j)). All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 670411, previously issued to JENNIFER LEIGH PLILER, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, JENNIFER LEIGH PLILER, is a Registered Nurse holding license number 670411, which is in "current" status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

On or about August 24, 2009, Respondent submitted an online licensure renewal application to the Board in which she falsely answered "no" to Renewal Question Number Two (2), which asked, in relevant part: "Have you, within the past 24 months or since your last renewal, for any criminal offense, including those pending appeal: ... C. pled nolo contendere, no contest, or guilty? D. received deferred adjudication? E. been placed on community supervision or court-ordered probation, whether or not adjudicated guilty? ... H. been arrested or have any pending criminal charges? I. been cited or charged with any violation of the law? ..."

a. On or about November 3, 2008, Respondent pled guilty to the offense "Theft Property more than \$20 and less than \$500 by check" (a Class B Misdemeanor offense committed on October 28, 2008) in the County Court of Harrison, Texas, Cause Number 20060963. As a result of the pleading, findings were deferred for a period of one (1) year and Respondent was placed on court probation.

b. On or about November 25, 2008, Respondent was arrested for the offenses "Burglary of Building" (a State Jail Felony offense committed on November 14, 2008) and "Theft of a Firearm" (a State Jail Felony offense committed on November 14, 2008) by the Harrison County Sheriff's Office, Marshall, Texas.

c. On or about January 27, 2009, Respondent was indicted by the Grand Jury for the County of Harrison, State of Texas, on the charge of Theft in violation of Penal Code Section 31.03.

Respondent's conduct was deceptive and may have influenced the Board's decision regarding renewal of her license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(2),(3)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(6)(H),(6)(I)&(13).

CHARGE II.

On or about January 13, 2010, Respondent pled nolo contendere to and was convicted of the offense of "Theft" (a State Jail Felony offense committed on November 14, 2008) in the 71st District Court of Harrison County, Texas, Case Number 09-0009X. As a result of the pleading, finding were deferred for a period of five (5) years and Respondent was placed on community supervision. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the public.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(3)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(13).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of up to revocation of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Board's rules, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 213.27 - 213.33. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to § 301.461, TEX. OCC. CODE ANN. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid by the Board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, Board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).

Respondent's failure to comply with Continuing Education requirements is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b) Texas Occupations Code to take disciplinary action against License Number 670411, heretofore issued to JENNIFER LEIGH PLILER, including revocation of Respondent's professional license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of a Fine in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100), and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, Annotated, as amended, Texas Occupations Code §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Professional Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 Texas Administrative Code, §211.01 *et seq.*, and this Order.



Documentation shall include copies of certificates of program attendance. These contact hours are to be taken in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may have for relicensure.

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
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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION
