

5. On or about July 1, 2009, while employed as a Charge Nurse with Borger Healthcare Center, Borger, Texas, Respondent failed to adequately assess and intervene while caring for Resident JS, who had been having episodes of emesis, and appeared to have vomited blood. When Respondent initially observed that the resident's emesis was brown-colored, she did not perform a focused assessment, and later, when the resident observed that there were bright red spots on the resident's linens and gown, she only checked the resident's abdomen for distention, but did not assess for bowel sounds or abdominal tenderness. Although Respondent notified the physician when she discovered that the resident had vomited bright red blood and received an order to transfer the resident to the hospital, she did not recognize that gastrointestinal bleeding is emergent, necessitating ambulance transport, and instead, sent the resident to the hospital via the facility van. Additionally, Respondent failed to accurately and completely document in the medical record of the resident, including her assessment data, except for vital signs, and all of her interventions. Respondent's conduct deprived the physician of information on which to base care decisions, exposed the resident to the risk of harm from clinical complications, including hemorrhaging and/or patient demise, and resulted in an incomplete, inaccurate medical record.
6. On August 24, 2010, Respondent returned Vocational Nurse License Number 210183 and submitted a notarized statement to the Board voluntarily surrendering the right to practice vocational nursing in Texas. A copy of Respondent's notarized statement, dated August 16, 2010, is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(D), (1)(M),(1)(P)&(2)(A) and 217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(C)&(4).
4. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
5. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
6. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.452 (b), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TAC §§213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the voluntary surrender of Vocational Nurse License Number 210183, heretofore issued to BARBARA ANN MARTINEZ, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice vocational nursing, use the title of vocational nurse or the abbreviation LVN or wear any insignia identifying herself as a vocational nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a vocational nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until: one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.


