**ORDER OF THE BOARD**

TO: JAMIE KAY BEAN

MILAM, TX 75959

During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on December 9, 2008, the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case. This case was heard, and based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing (22 TEX. ADMIN.CODE § 213.2(j)). All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 197209, previously issued to JAMIE KAY BEAN, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 197209, previously issued to JAMIE KAY BEAN, upon receipt of this Order, be immediately delivered to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multi-state privilege, if any, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

### **FIRST AMENDED FORMAL CHARGES**

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, JAMIE KAY BEAN, is a Vocational Nurse holding license number 197209, which is in delinquent status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

#### **CHARGE I.**

On or about July 21, 2006, while employed as a Charge Nurse with Hemphill Care Center, Hemphill, Texas, Respondent failed to adequately assess Resident Number 2009 after being notified that the resident had fallen and Respondent noted that the resident had sustained a bruise. After the resident complained of pain for five additional (5) days, the resident was transferred to an acute care center, where it was determined that she had suffered a fractured femur. Respondent's conduct was neglectful and was likely to injure the resident from undetected complications, including possible demise.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(M)&(2)(A) and 217.12 (1)(A),(1)(B),(4)&(6)(C).

#### **CHARGE II.**

On or about July 21, 2006, while employed as a Charge Nurse with Hemphill Care Center, Hemphill, Texas, Respondent failed to notify the physician that Resident Number 2009 had fallen and sustained a bruise, as required. After the resident complained of pain for five additional (5) days, the resident was transferred to an acute care center, where it was determined that she had suffered a fractured femur. Respondent's conduct was neglectful, caused the resident to suffer pain unnecessarily, and unnecessarily delayed medical interventions needed to stabilize the resident's condition and/or prevent further complications, including possible demise.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(D),(1)(M)&(1)(P) and 217.12 (1)(A),(1)(B),(4)&(6)(C).

### CHARGE III.

On or about July 21, 2006, while employed as a Charge Nurse with Hemphill Care Center, Hemphill, Texas, Respondent failed to document in the medical record that that Resident Number 2009 had fallen and sustained a bruise, as required. After the resident complained of pain for five additional (5) days, the resident was transferred to an acute care center, where it was determined that she had suffered a fractured femur. Respondent's conduct was neglectful, caused the resident to suffer pain unnecessarily, and delayed medical interventions needed to stabilize the resident's condition and/or prevent further complications, including possible demise.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 217.11(1)(A),(1)(B)&(1)(D) and 217.12 (1)(A),(1)(B),(4)&(6)(C).

### CHARGE IV.

On or about July 21, 2006, while employed as a Charge Nurse with Hemphill Care Center, Hemphill, Texas, Respondent failed to report that Resident Number 2009 had fallen to the oncoming shift nurse, as appropriate. After the resident complained of pain for five (5) days, the resident was transferred to an acute care center, where it was determined that she had suffered a fractured femur. Respondent's conduct was neglectful, caused the resident to suffer pain unnecessarily, and delayed medical interventions needed to stabilize the resident's condition and/or prevent further complications, including possible demise.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(D),(1)(M)&(1)(P) and 217.12 (1)(A),(1)(B),(4)&(6)(C).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of revocation of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Board's rules, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 213.27 - 213.33. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to § 301.461, TEX. OCC. CODE ANN. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid by the board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).


