On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of STEVE JAUBERT, Registered Nurse License Number 663534, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may have violated Section 301.452(b)(2), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on August 20, 2009, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, Executive Director.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license.
2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
4. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Charity/Delgado College, New Orleans, Louisiana on December 18, 1992. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on August 18, 1999.

6. At the time of the initial incident, Respondent was employed by Advantage Nursing Service, Metairie, Louisiana, as a Registered Nurse with Tenet Healthcare System, New Orleans, Louisiana, and had been in this position for two (2) months.
7. On or about August 2, 1999, Respondent submitted an Application for Registration as a Professional Nurse on Temporary License/Endorsement Application to the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas in which Respondent provided false, deceptive, and/or misleading information, in that he answered "No" to the question, "Have you ever been convicted of a crime other than minor traffic violations?".

On or about June 18, 1980, Respondent was arrested by the New York State Police, Troop B, Champlain, New York and charged with Unlawful Possession Or Sale Of Noxious Matter, a Class B Misdemeanor and On or about June 18, 1980, Respondent entered a plea of guilty in Champlain Town Court, Champlain, New York under Case No. 148 and received a conditional discharge.

On or about June 21, 1983, Respondent was arrested and charged with credit card abuse (Felony) by the Austin Police Department, Austin, Texas.

On May 17, 1995, Respondent pled guilty to Credit Card Abuse, a third degree felony and received Deferred Adjudication with community supervision for two years and was discharged from community supervision on June 10, 1997.

8. Respondent self reported all of the criminal history and has not committed a violation or been charged with any offense after the last reported incident of June 10, 1997.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555 , the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.

The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(2), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(6)(A),(H)&(I).

3. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 663534, heretofore issued to STEVE JAUBERT, including revocation of Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of REMEDIAL EDUCATION, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license is encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

RESPONDENT SHALL deliver the wallet-sized license issued to STEVE JAUBERT

to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing within ten (10) days of the date of ratification of this Order.

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify RESPONDENT's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address:*

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT's license and RESPONDENT shall be eligible for multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Agreed Order. I waive representation by counsel. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid further disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that when this Order becomes final and the terms of this Order become effective, a copy will be mailed to me. I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including revocation of my license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.


