ORDER OF THE BOARD

During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on Tuesday, August 18, 2009, the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case. This case was heard, and based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to

Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing (22 TEX. ADMIN.CODE § 213.2(j)). All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 684679, previously issued to Allison Elaina Miller, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 684679, previously issued to ALLISON ELAINA MILLER, upon receipt of this Order, be immediately delivered to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multi-state privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, ALLISON ELAINA MILLER, is a Registered Nurse holding license number 684679, which is in current status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

On or about January 19, 2006, while employed at Midland Memorial Hospital, Midland, Texas, Respondent withdrew Lortab from the Medication Dispensing System for Patient Medical Record Number 2000374395, but failed to completely and accurately document the administration of the medication, including signs, symptoms and responses, in the patient's Medication Administration Record (MAR), Nurses Notes, or both as follows:

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(D) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)&(C),(4),(6)(A)&(H)&(10)(B).

CHARGE II.

On or about January 19, 2006, while employed at Midland Memorial Hospital, Midland, Texas, Respondent withdrew Lortab from the Medication Dispensing System for Patient Medical Record Number 2000374395, but failed to follow the policy and procedure for the wastage of any unused portions of Lortab as follows:

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A) & (D), and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)&(C),(4),(6)(A)&(H)&(10)(B)&(C).

CHARGE III.

On or about January 19, 2006, while employed at Midland Memorial Hospital, Midland, Texas, Respondent misappropriated Lortab belonging to the facility and patients thereof, or failed to take precautions to prevent such misappropriation as follows:

Respondent's conduct above was likely to defraud the facility and patients of the cost of the medications.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(4),(6)(G)&(H)&(10)(E).

CHARGE IV.

On or about July 25, 2006, Respondent submitted a specimen for a drug/alcohol screen requested by Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN), which resulted positive for the presence of Hydromorphone. Possession of Hydromorphone is prohibited by Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act). The use of Hydromorphone by a Registered Nurse, while subject or call to duty, could impair the nurse's ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in the patient's condition, and could impair the nurse's ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patient in potential danger.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(9)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(5)&(10)(D).

CHARGE V.

On or about October 10, 2006, Respondent submitted a specimen for a drug/alcohol screen, requested by Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses, which resulted positive for the presence of Propoxyphene. Possession of Propoxyphene is prohibited by Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act). The use of Propoxyphene by a Registered Nurse, while subject or call to duty, could impair the nurse's ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in the patient's condition, and could impair the nurse's ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patient in potential danger.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(9)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(5)&(10)(D).

CHARGE VI.

On or about May 18, 2007, while employed at Health South Rehabilitation Hospital of Odessa, Texas, Respondent withdrew Lortab 7.5mg and Norco 10mg from the narcotic drawer for patients, but failed to completely and accurately document the administration of the medication, including signs, symptoms and responses, in the patients' Medication Administration Records (MARs), Nurses Notes, or both as follows:

CHARGE X.

On or about August 1, 2007, through August 9, 2007, while employed at In Home Care, Inc., Midland,

Texas, Respondent misappropriated Hydrocodone belonging to the facility and patients thereof, or failed to take precautions to prevent such misappropriation in that Respondent took medications from a patient's home during an in home care visit, and from another co-worker's car. Respondent's conduct was likely to defraud the facility and patients of the cost of the medications.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(4),(6)(G)&(H)&(10)(E).

CHARGE XI.

On or about September 10, 2007; September 18, 2007; and September 24, 2007, Respondent obtained unauthorized refills for Norco 10-325mg from the Wal-Mart Pharmacy, Odessa, Texas.

Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive the pharmacy and possession of Norco through the use of a unauthorized prescription is prohibited by Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act).

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)&(C),(6)(A)&(H)&(10)(B)&(E).

CHARGE XII.

On or about September 10, 2007; September 18, 2007; and September 24, 2007, Respondent misappropriated Norco 10-325mg belonging to Patient DLB. Respondent's conduct was likely to defraud the facility and patients of the cost of the medications.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(4),(6)(G)&(H)&(10)(E).

CHARGE XIII.

On or about May 5, 2008, while employed with Odessa Regional Medical Center, Odessa, Texas, Respondent removed Lortab from the Pyxis Medication Dispensing System for patients and failed to accurately and/or completely document its administration, including signs, symptoms and responses, in the patient's medication administration record (MAR) and/or nurse's notes as follows:

NOTICE IS GIVEN that to the extent applicable, based on the Formal Charges, the Board will rely on Adopted Disciplinary Sanction Policies for Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder, Lying and Falsification Fraud, Theft & Deception which can be found at the Board's website, www.bon.state.tx.us.
