

4. Respondent received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from Texas Women's University, Houston, Texas, on May 1, 1994. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on June 15, 1994. Respondent received approval to practice as an Emergency Nurse Practitioner on June 2, 2000, and Prescription authorization on April 19, 2002.

5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

6. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as an Emergency Nurse Practitioner in the psychiatric practice of James Robert Wright, III, MD, PA, Houston, Texas, and had been in this position for six (6) months.

7. On or about May 2007 through August 2007, while employed as an Emergency Nurse Practitioner in the psychiatric practice of James Robert Wright, III, MD, PA, Houston, Texas, Respondent exceeded her authorized scope of advanced practice regarding Patient SK by managing the patient's psychiatric medical care without the required educational preparation and authorizations. Respondent completed the patient's psychiatric evaluation, then presented the documentation to the physician who completed the patient's psychiatric medical plan of care, and ordered the dispensing of medication samples. Although the psychiatrist signed Respondent's documentation, his signature indicated that he agreed with the content and treatment plan formulated by Respondent and Respondent documented no collaboration with the psychiatrist as part of the process. Respondent's conduct may have contributed to the improper recording of the patient's medical information.

8. In response to the incident in Finding of Fact Number Seven (7), Respondent states that after contacting the Medical Board and the Board of Nursing, she and Dr. Wright believed

that a physician could provide additional training that would satisfy the requirement for Psychiatric Advanced Nurse Practice. Respondent also states that during the initial evaluation of Patient SK, Respondent took the history and presented it to Dr. Wright in the presence of Patient SK. In regard to subsequent appointments, Respondent states she relayed Patient SK's follow up visit information to the physician who then determined the medical plan of care, and that medication samples were dispensed under the direction of Dr. Wright. The spouse of Patient SK stated to Respondent and Dr. Wright in a subsequent office visit that he believed Patient SK had taken more than the prescribed amount of medication.

9. On December 13, 2008, Respondent successfully completed the Nursing Jurisprudence and Ethics Course and submitted the certificate to the Texas Board of Nursing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(D)&(4)(A), 221.12(1), 221.13(b).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against License Number 604423, heretofore issued to C. JEANETTE WRIGHT, including revocation of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of a Fine with Remedial Education, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice nursing in compact states.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license is encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the Texas Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL deliver the wallet-sized license issued to C. JEANETTE WRIGHT to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing within ten (10) days of the date of ratification of this Order.

(2) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order successfully complete a course in nursing documentation. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. The course shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length of classroom time. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include Nurses. The course shall include content on the following: nursing standards related to accurate and complete documentation; legal guidelines for recording; methods and processes of recording; methods of alternative record-keeping; and computerized documentation. RESPONDENT SHALL cause the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Board's office to verify RESPONDENT's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved*

(3) RESPONDENT SHALL pay a monetary fine in the amount of five-hundred (\$500.00) dollar amount. RESPONDENT SHALL pay this fine within forty-five (45) days of entry of this Order. Payment is to be made directly to the Texas Board of Nursing in the form of cashier's check or U.S. money order. Partial payments will not be accepted.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT's license and RESPONDENT shall be eligible for multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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
RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION
