On the date entered below, the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the Petition for Declaratory Order and supporting documents filed by DONALD LEO ANDERSON, hereinafter referred to as PETITIONER, together with any documents and information gathered by staff and PETITIONER's Certificate contained herein. Information received by the Board produced evidence that PETITIONER may have violated Section 301.452(b) *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.

PETITIONER waived representation by counsel, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on July 14, 2006, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, Executive Director.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about February 28, 2006, Petitioner submitted a Petition for Declaratory Order requesting a determination of eligibility for licensure in compliance with Section 301.257 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.
2. Petitioner waived representation, notice, administrative hearing, and judicial review.
3. Petitioner graduated with an Associate Degree in Nursing from El Paso Community College, El Paso, Texas, in May 2006.
4. Petitioner completed the Petition for Declaratory Order and answered "yes" to Question Number Two (2), which reads as follows: *"Have you been convicted, adjudged guilty by a court, pled guilty, no contest or nolo contendere to any crime in any state, territory or country, whether or not a sentence was imposed, including any pending criminal charges or unresolved arrests (excluding minor traffic violations)? This includes expunged offenses and*

deferred adjudication with or without prejudice of guilt. Please note that DUI's, DWT's, PI's must be reported and are not considered minor traffic violations. (One time minor in possession [MIP] or minor in consumption [MIC] do not need to be disclosed, therefore, you may answer "No." If you have two or more MIP's or MIC's, you must answer "Yes".)

5. Petitioner disclosed the following criminal history, to wit:
 - A. On October 8, 1981, Petitioner was charged with the felony offense of Burglary of a Vehicle in the District Court of El Paso, Texas. On January 11, 1982, Petitioner was convicted and was sentenced to three (3) years community supervision.
 - B. On March 17, 2001, Petitioner was charged with the felony offense of Possession of a Controlled Substance in the District Court of El Paso County, Texas. On July 9, 2001, Petitioner was found guilty by the presiding judge and placed on two (2) years deferred adjudication. Petitioner's probation was extended one (1) year on April 28, 2003. On June 24, 2004, Petitioner was granted early discharge from probation.
6. Petitioner's criminal history report discloses that on October 5, 1970, Petitioner was charged with the offense of Burglary in El Paso County, Texas, and on November 7, 1970, Petitioner was charged with the offense of Possession of Marijuana in El Paso County, Texas. No disposition for these offenses was provided by Petitioner.
7. Petitioner's criminal history report also discloses that he was charged with Attempt to Commit Homicide in El Paso, Texas, with the grand jury returning a "No Bill" for this offense. Petitioner's explanation for this offense is that as he was burglarizing a vehicle in a bar parking lot (Petitioner's 1981 felony conviction), the owner came out of the bar and approached Petitioner with a gun. Petitioner states he grabbed the gun and they wrestled and the gun went off. Petitioner states "I thought I was fighting for my life. I did not want to hurt the guy but he had a gun. I did not want to die either."
8. There is no evidence of any subsequent criminal conduct.
9. Petitioner completed the Petition for Declaratory Order and answered "no" to Question Number Five (5), which reads as follows: *"Within the past five (5) years have you been addicted to and/or treated for the use of alcohol or any other drug?"*
10. A progress report dated January 10, 2006, was submitted to the Board by Yesenia I. Arras, LCSW, Department of Veteran Affairs, El Paso, Texas, stating that Petitioner entered a treatment program on September 16, 2002, for cocaine dependence. Petitioner then entered the Drug Court Program in December 2002 and successfully completed intensive treatment compliance monitoring. On August 26, 2004, Petitioner had a diagnosis of "Cocaine Dependence full sustained remission."
11. On April 19, 2006, Petitioner was requested to undergo a Forensic Psychological Evaluation

to include a Chemical Dependency Component and Polygraph Exam. On June 20, 2006, Petitioner presented to Matthew L. Ferrara, Ph.D., Austin, Texas, to undergo a forensic psychological evaluation to include a chemical dependency component and polygraph examination. The results of the evaluation indicate that Petitioner is able to consistently conform his behavior to the Nursing Practice Act, Board rules and regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice. Petitioner's responses on the SASSI-III yielded a rating of low probability of a substance abuse disorder. However, Petitioner does have a history of substance abuse and legal problems, which cannot be ignored. On February 17, 2006, Petitioner was administered a polygraph examination by Peter Heller with no signs of deception indicated.

12. Petitioner presented evidence of current fitness to practice professional nursing.
13. The Board received letters of support/recommendation for Petitioner from the following:
 - A letter of recommendation dated October 14, 2005, was submitted to the Board on behalf of Petitioner by Max Veltman, RNC, MSN, CPNP, El Paso Community College, El Paso, Texas.
 - A letter of recommendation dated July 7, 2005, was submitted to the Board on behalf of Petitioner by Patty Shanaberger, RN, MSN, Family Nurse Practitioner, Nursing Faculty, El Paso Community College, El Paso, Texas.
14. The safety of patients and the public requires that all persons licensed to practice nursing be fit, sober, and able to consistently practice nursing in autonomous roles under demanding and stressful conditions.
15. The Executive Director considered evidence of Petitioner's substance abuse as provided in §213.29, 22 Texas Administrative Code.
16. The Executive Director's review of the grounds for potential ineligibility has been made on the basis of the information provided by Petitioner.
17. Petitioner has sworn that, with the exception of matters disclosed in connection with the Petition for Declaratory Order, his past behavior conforms to the Board's professional character requirements. Petitioner presented no evidence of behavior which is inconsistent with the Board's character requirements in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.27.
18. On or about July 14, 2006, the Executive Director considered evidence of Petitioner's past behavior in light of the character factors set out in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.27 and determined that Petitioner currently demonstrates the criteria required for good professional character.
19. In consideration of Petitioner's past conduct and subsequent evidence of rehabilitation, the

Executive Director finds that Petitioner should be declared conditionally eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses.

20. Petitioner's compliance with the terms of a Board approved peer assistance program should be sufficient to protect patients and the public.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board of Nurse Examiners has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 301.453, Texas Occupations Code.
2. Petitioner has submitted a petition in compliance with Section 301.257, Texas Occupations Code.
3. Petitioner shall immediately notify the Board of any fact or event that could constitute a ground of ineligibility for licensure under Section 301.452, Texas Occupations Code.
4. The Board of Nurse Examiners may license an individual who has a history of substance abuse, after consideration of the criteria set out in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.29, the Board determines the Petitioner does not currently pose a direct threat to the health and safety of patients or the public.
5. The Board may, in its discretion, order a Petitioner, upon initial licensure as a registered nurse, to participate in a peer assistance program approved by the Board if the nurse would otherwise have been eligible for referral to peer assistance pursuant to Section 301.410, Texas Occupations Code.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that upon meeting the requirements for graduation and payment of any required fees, DONALD LEO ANDERSON, PETITIONER, is CONDITIONALLY ELIGIBLE to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN® Examination). PETITIONER SHALL NOT be eligible for temporary authorization to practice as a Graduate Nurse in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that PETITIONER SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended, Texas Occupations Code

§§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Professional Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.01 *et seq.*, and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that PETITIONER, upon attaining a passing grade on the NCLEX-RN®, shall be issued a license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IN ADDITION, IT IS THEREFORE FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that PETITIONER, upon initial licensure, SHALL comply with the following conditions for such a time as is required for PETITIONER to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN):

(1) PETITIONER SHALL, within forty-five (45) days of initial licensure, apply to and be accepted into the TPAPN, which SHALL include payment of a non-refundable participation fee in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) payable to TPAPN.

(2) Upon acceptance into the TPAPN, PETITIONER SHALL waive confidentiality and provide a copy of the executed TPAPN contract to the Board of Nurse Examiners.

(3) PETITIONER SHALL comply with all requirements of the TPAPN contract during its term.

(4) PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE the TPAPN to notify the Board of Nurse Examiners of any violation of the TPAPN contract.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Petitioner's multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Petitioner's license is encumbered by this Order, Petitioner may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a

multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party State where Petitioner wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD PETITIONER fail to comply with this Order or the terms of the participation agreement with the TPAPN, such noncompliance will result in further disciplinary action including revocation of PETITIONER's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

PETITIONER'S CERTIFICATION

I am the Petitioner in this matter. I have fully and truthfully disclosed all relevant information in conformity with Rule 213.29 at Texas Administrative Code. I certify that my past behavior, except as disclosed in my Petition for Declaratory Order, has been in conformity with the Board's professional character rule. I have provided the Board with complete and accurate documentation of my past behavior in violation of the penal law of any jurisdiction which was disposed of through any procedure short of conviction, such as: conditional discharge, deferred adjudication or dismissal. I have no criminal prosecution pending in any jurisdiction.

In connection with my petition, I acknowledge that I have read and I understand Section 301.257, Texas Occupations Code, Section 301.452 (a), (b) and (c), Texas Occupations Code, and Chapter 53, Section 53.001 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code, and Board Rules 213.27, 213.28, and 213.29 at 22 Texas Administrative Code. I agree with all terms of this Order, including the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and any stipulations set out in this Order. I acknowledge that this Order is stipulated and I understand that I am not eligible to receive a Graduate Nurse Permit to practice. I agree to inform the Board of any other fact or event that could constitute a ground for denial of licensure prior to registering for the NCLEX-RN® Examination or accepting any permit or license from the Board of Nurse Examiners.

I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including revocation of my license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.

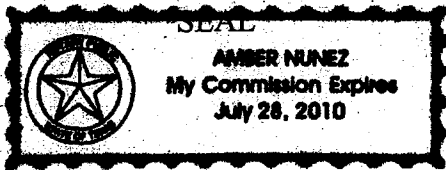
