On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of TANYA LOGAN, Privilege to Practice from Virginia Practical Nurse License Number 0002080355, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Sections 301.452(b)(1),(10)&(13) and 304.001, Article 5, Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on November 19, 2012.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia, a member of the Nurse Licensure Compact.
4. Respondent received a Certificate in Practical Nursing from Medical Careers Institute, Virginia Beach, Virginia, on March 26, 2009. Respondent was licensed to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia on May 26, 2009.
5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

1/2010 - 11/2010	Private Duty Nurse	San Antonio, Texas
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Respondent's nursing employment history continued:

12/2010 - 2/2011	Unknown	
3/2011 - 4/2011	Vocational Nurse	River City Care Center San Antonio, Texas
5/2011 - Present	Unknown	

6. On or about January 28, 2010, through April 20, 2011, Respondent practiced as a Vocational Nurse in the State of Texas without having a valid privilege or license to practice nursing in the State of Texas, as follows:
 - January 28, 2010 through November 2010 - Respondent practiced Private Duty Vocational Nursing at the residence of Patient GH, San Antonio, Texas; and
 - March 10, 2011, through April 20, 2011 - Respondent accepted a permanent position and practiced Vocational Nursing at River City Care Center, San Antonio, Texas.Respondent had changed her residence from Virginia to Texas, as indicated on the September 23, 2009, Endorsement Application she submitted to the Board, but failed to complete the Texas requirements for licensure and continued to practice vocational nursing in Texas, in violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §220.1(f), after the temporary license issued to her expired on January 27, 2010. Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive the employer and the public, including patients and their families, into believing that she had met all requirements for licensure to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.
7. In response to the incidents in Finding of Fact Number Six (6), Respondent states that she thought she could stay in Texas as long as she kept Virginia as her home state.
8. Formal Charges were filed on September 24, 2012.
9. Formal Charges were mailed to Respondent on September 25, 2012.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555 and 304.001, Article 5, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§217.11(1)(A), 217.12(1)(A)&(1)(B) and 220.1(f).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Sections 301.452(b)(1),(10)&(13) and 304.001, Article 5, Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Privilege to Practice from Virginia Practical Nurse License Number 0002080355, heretofore issued to TANYA LOGAN.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of a REMEDIAL EDUCATION AND A FINE, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that, while under the terms of this Order, this Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to Respondent to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license(s) is/are encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a nurse licensure compact privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the

Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify RESPONDENT'S successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address: <http://www.bon.texas.gov/disciplinaryaction/stipscourses.html>.*

(2) RESPONDENT SHALL pay a monetary fine in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). RESPONDENT SHALL pay this fine within forty five (45) days of entry of this Order. Payment is to be made directly to the Texas Board of Nursing in the form of cashier's check or U.S. money order. Partial payments will not be accepted.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL, within thirty (30) days of entry of this Order, complete and submit to the Board the appropriate application(s) for licensure as a nurse in the State of Texas and meet all Texas licensure requirements or CEASE and DESIST from the practice of nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that, upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT shall be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

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
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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION



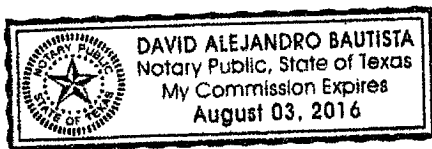
