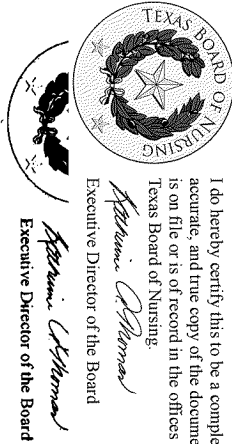
During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on February 10, 2008, the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case. This case was heard, and based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

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The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing (22 TEX. ADMIN.CODE § 213.2(j)). All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 597950, previously issued to Lisa Diane Price, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 597950, previously issued to Lisa Diane Price, upon receipt of this Order, be immediately delivered to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multi-state privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, LISA DIANE PRICE, is a Registered Nurse holding license number 597950, which is in delinquent status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

On or about November 15, 2006, Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Arizona was REVOKED by the Arizona State Board of Nursing, Phoenix, Arizona, for substance abuse and failure to complete the CANDO Program.

A copy of the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Arizona State Board of Nursing Order No. 0608001, dated November 15, 2006, is attached and incorporated, by reference, as part of this pleading.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(8), Texas Occupations Code.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of revocation of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Board's rules, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 213.27 - 213.33. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to § 301.461, TEX. OCC. CODE ANN. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid by the board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).



**FINDINGS OF FACT,
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
AND ORDER NO. 0608001**

On November 15, 2006, the Arizona State Board of Nursing ("Board") considered the State's Motion to Deem Allegations Admitted and Recommended Discipline and Respondent's Response to the Motion, if any, at the Arizona Board of Nursing, 4747 North 7th Street, Suite 200, Phoenix Arizona 85014. Michelle L. Wood, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the State. Respondent was not present and was not represented by counsel.

On November 15, 2006, the Board granted the State's Motion to Deem Allegations Admitted. Based upon A.R.S. § 32-1663(G) and Notice of Charges No. 0608001 filed in this matter, the Board adopts the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and **REVOKES** Respondent's license.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Lisa Diane Price ("Respondent") holds Board issued professional nurse license no. RN135600.
2. The Board has authority pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-1606, 32-1663, and 32-1664 to impose disciplinary sanctions against the holders of nursing licenses for violations of the Nurse Practice Act, A.R.S. §§ 32-1601 to -1667.
3. On or about May 26, 2005, Respondent self-reported to the Board that she was addicted to marijuana and had a positive pre-employment drug screen for marijuana.

1 4. On or about May 31, 2005, Board staff interviewed Respondent for entry into the
2 CANDO program. Respondent admitted that she had used marijuana for five years, smoking it two to
3 three times a week. She related that she had used marijuana to help control her panic attacks. On
4 March 10, 2004, she decided to stop using marijuana. According to Respondent, she realized that the
5 panic attacks were persistent and she was becoming paranoid, so she stopped using marijuana.
6 However, on or about April 29, 2005, while attending her "going away party", she was offered a
7 marijuana joint and she took four "tokes" of a "really strong marijuana joint".
8

9 5. On or about May 31, 2005, and contingent upon the Board's acceptance, Respondent
10 signed the CANDO Stipulated Agreement which, in part, required her to attend a chemical dependency
11 treatment program, enroll in a drug screening program and submit to required monthly random drug
12 screens, attend two AA meetings per week, abstain from the use of alcohol and narcotics, attend
13 aftercare, abstain from unauthorized drug use, notify CANDO of any prescription received, to refrain
14 from working as a nurse until approval to return to work was obtained from the CANDO consultant and
15 upon return to nursing practice, abide by standard nursing practice restrictions.
16

17 6. On or about June 14, 2005, Respondent submitted to the Board a professional nurse
18 application by endorsement.
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20 7. On or about September 23, 2005, Respondent was granted a professional nurse license
21 by the Board and acceptance into the CANDO program.
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23 8. On or about July 6, 2006, Board staff spoke to Judy Bischoff, Regional Director for
24 Value Options in Phoenix, Arizona. Bischoff stated that she had interviewed Respondent, who
25 disclosed that she was in the CANDO program. However, when Respondent was interviewed by a
26 prospective manager, Respondent was very slow to respond, had to be prompted to respond and denied

ORDER

In view of the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board issues the following

Order:

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1664(N), the Board hereby **REVOKES** professional nurse license number RN135600 issued to Lisa Diane Price.

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.09, Respondent may file, in writing, a motion for rehearing or review within 30 days after service of this decision with the Arizona State Board of Nursing. The motion for rehearing or review shall be made to the attention of Susan Barber, R.N., M.S.N., Arizona State Board of Nursing, 4747 North 7th Street, Suite 200, Phoenix AZ 85014. For answers to questions regarding a rehearing, contact Susan Barber at (602) 889-5161. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.09(B), if Respondent fails to file a motion for rehearing or review within 30 days after service of this decision, Respondent shall be prohibited from seeking judicial review of this decision.

This decision is effective upon expiration of the time for filing a request for rehearing or review, or upon denial of such request, whichever is later, as mandated in A.A.C. R4-19-609.

Respondent may apply for reinstatement of said license pursuant to A.A.C. R4-19-404 after a period of five years.
