On this day came to be considered by the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, the Petition for Reinstatement of Registered Nurse License Number 551039 and Vocational Nurse License Number 69863, held by DIANA SUE BOLIN, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner.

An informal conference was held on September 30, 2014, at the office of the Texas Board of Nursing, in accordance with Section 301.464, Texas Occupations Code.

Petitioner appeared in person. Petitioner was represented by Taralynn R. Mackay, Attorney at Law. In attendance were Kristin Benton, MSN, RN, Director of Nursing, Executive Director's Designee; John Vanderford, Assistant General Counsel; Anthony L. Diggs, MSCJ, Director, Enforcement Division; and Diane E. Burell, Investigator.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Petitioner and Petitioner was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Petitioner waived notice and hearing, and consented to the entry of this Order.
3. Petitioner received a Certificate in Vocational Nursing from St. Philips College Vocational Nursing Program, San Antonio, Texas, on May 27, 1976, and a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, Texas, on December 14, 1988. Petitioner was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas on November 19, 1976, and Petitioner was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on April 4, 1989.
4. Petitioner's nursing employment history includes:

5. On August 17, 2009, the Board accepted the voluntary surrender of Petitioner's license(s) to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas. A copy of the August 17, 2009, Agreed Order, Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law, is attached and incorporated, by reference, as a part of this Order.
6. On or about July 2, 2014, Petitioner submitted a Petition for Reinstatement of License to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
7. Petitioner presented the following in support of her petition:
  - 7.1. Letter, dated November 2, 2011, from Steven M. Moreno, US Probation Officer, Western District of Texas/Del Rio Division, stating Petitioner was convicted in US District Court in Del Rio, of Count One of the Indictment, charging her with Conspiracy to Illegally Transport Aliens. On December 22, 2008, Petitioner was sentenced to twenty-seven (27) months imprisonment, followed by a three (3) year term of Supervised Release. Petitioner completed the confinement portion of her sentence on June 8, 2011, and is currently under the supervision of the US Probation Office in Del Rio, Texas. Petitioner's term of Supervised Release is projected to expire on June 7, 2014.
  - 7.2. Letter of support, from David Gonzalez, MD, Medical Director, Psychiatric Inpatient Management Services, stating he has worked with Petitioner for over a year in an outpatient clinic. He has seen her doing patient contact in an appropriate and respectful manner and has always been accountable for her behavior and actions. During Dr. Gonzalez' contact with Petitioner, she has been able to distinguish between right and wrong, act rationally and meet her obligations for the patients needs.
  - 7.3. Letter of support, dated May 12, 2014, from Richard Lankes, MD, South Texas Rural Health, Carrizo Springs, Texas, stating he has known and worked with Petitioner from 1976 through 2007 both directly and indirectly. He believes Petitioner to be a compassionate and very dedicated nurse. Dr. Lankes continues that Petitioner has a broad knowledge in hospital, nursing home and dialysis settings. He would allow her to care for him and his family. Over the years he states she demonstrated good nursing judgment and puts her patients and family first. Dr. Lankes highly commends her for her clinical and supervisory skills and says besides her patients Petitioner would go to out and help her staff in order to provide a better quality of care, and quality of life.
  - 7.4. Letter of support, dated May 12, 2014, from Robert Diaz, Elderly Programs Director, Community Services Agency of South Texas, Inc., Carrizo Springs, Texas, stating he had known Petitioner since 1978 when she worked for San Antonio State Hospital. He states Petitioner is a very dedicated and caring individual who will go the extra mile when it comes to providing quality care to individuals in need with health related issues. In the past, Petitioner has served on various advisory boards in which her input was well received among the other advisory board members when discussing health issue needs. As a nurse, Petitioner is well respected in the community by her peers in the medical field. Mr. Diaz explains Petitioner has volunteered many hours at the CSA Elderly Nutrition Center in Carrizo Springs, TX in providing nutrition education and other health related topics to the elderly population in the community.

- 7.5. Letter of support, dated November 28, 2011, from Sylvia Bradley, LVN/Director, Mi Familia Adult Day Care & Health Services, LLC, Carrizo Springs, Texas, stating she has known Petitioner and worked with her since 1977 when she was an LVN at the San Antonio State Hospital Outreach. Ms. Bradley later worked under Petitioner in her role as RN DON at the Nursing Home she was very dedicated to her residents and the staff. Petitioner demonstrated good judgement and was out for the patient care and the education of the staff. Since that time Petitioner has worked with Ms. Bradley as her RN consultant prior to her surrendering her license. Despite her situation she continued to demonstrate good nursing judgement, honesty, patient advocacy and was very dependable.
  - 7.6. Letter of support, dated June 24, 2014, from Cynthia McCaleb, LPC, Hill Country Community Mental Health. Ms. McCaleb has been with Hill Country Community Mental Health since 2007 and has worked with Petitioner since September of 2012. Petitioner role is business manager and she plays an important part in the overall operations of the clinic, impacting Ms. McCaleb's job as a counselor. From her observations Petitioner has been punctual and dependable, making an effort to the best job possible - with excellence. Ms. McCaleb states the job of business manager is very stressful and demanding, often multitasking and coping with difficult people and situations, but Petitioner has a great deal of energy moving quickly from one task to another while remaining alert to what is going on around her. Ms. McCaleb feels that Petitioner is honest and trustworthy.
  - 7.7. Documentation of the required continuing education contact hours.
8. On October 29, 2014, Petitioner underwent a forensic psychological evaluation conducted by Joyce M. Gayles, Ph.D. Dr. Gayles concluded that Petitioner has no major problems or propensity toward criminal behavior at this time. The results of the evaluation indicate that Petitioner should be able to provide care to patients with skill and safety. Dr. Gayles further stated that Petitioner can be expected to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of a nurse based on the Board's guidelines and to act in a professional manner.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Pursuant to Section 301.467, Texas Occupations Code, the Board may refuse to issue or renew a license, and may set a reasonable period that must lapse before reapplication. Pursuant to 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26, the Board may impose reasonable conditions that a Petitioner must satisfy before reissuance of an unrestricted license.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that the petition of DIANA SUE BOLIN, Registered Nurse License Number 551039 and Vocational Nurse License Number 69863, to practice nursing in the state of Texas, be and the same is hereby GRANTED, AND SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS SO LONG AS THE PETITIONER complies in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 *et. seq.* and the stipulations contained in this Order:

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that, while under the terms of this Order, this Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to Petitioner to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Petitioner's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Petitioner's license(s) is/are encumbered by this Order, Petitioner may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a nurse licensure compact privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Petitioner wishes to work.

(1) PETITIONER SHALL NOT seek employment or practice nursing for compensation until she has completed the following pre-licensure conditions and obtained a license to practice professional nursing from the Board.

(2) PETITIONER SHALL apply for a "Six-Month Clinical Permit" for the limited purpose of completing a refresher course. PETITIONER SHALL NOT, in any way, attempt to use this clinical permit for any purpose other than attending this course.

(3) PETITIONER SHALL successfully complete a nursing refresher course prior to returning to the practice of professional nursing in the State of Texas. PETITIONER SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. The course content shall include: 1) the role of the professional nurse; 2) a review of the nursing process to include assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation; 3) Pharmacology review; 4) medication administration review for all standard route of administration; 5) documentation, quality assurance and legal implications for nursing practice; and 6) current CPR certification. This course must contain a minimum 80-hour clinical component, providing direct patient care, which is to be supervised by another registered nurse.

(4) Upon completion of the refresher course, PETITIONER SHALL return the clinical permit to the office of the Board, and PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to notify the Board, on a form provided by the Board, of Petitioner's successful completion of the refresher course, including the required clinical component.

(5) Upon verification of successful completion of the agreed pre-licensure probation conditions of reinstatement, as set out in this Order, PETITIONER SHALL pay all re-registration fees and be issued the applicable license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas, which shall be subject to the following agreed post-licensure probation conditions:

(6) PETITIONER SHALL, within one (1) year of relicensure, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. PETITIONER SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics,

confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify PETITIONER's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure.

(7) PETITIONER SHALL, within one (1) year of relicensure, successfully complete the course "Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills," a 3.6 contact hour online program provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension. In order to receive credit for completion of this program, PETITIONER SHALL SUBMIT the continuing education certificate of completion for this program to the Board's office, to the attention of Monitoring. This course is to be taken in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may have for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address: <http://www.bon.texas.gov/compliance>.*

**IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD PETITIONER CHOOSE TO WORK AS A NURSE IN TEXAS, PETITIONER WILL PROVIDE DIRECT PATIENT CARE AND PRACTICE IN A HOSPITAL, NURSING HOME, OR OTHER CLINICAL SETTING A MINIMUM OF SIXTY-FOUR (64) HOURS PER MONTH UNDER THE FOLLOWING PROBATION CONDITIONS FOR TWO (2) YEARS OF EMPLOYMENT. THE LENGTH OF THE PROBATION PERIOD WILL BE EXTENDED UNTIL SUCH TWENTY-FOUR (24) MONTHS HAVE ELAPSED. PERIODS OF UNEMPLOYMENT OR OF EMPLOYMENT THAT DO NOT REQUIRE THE USE OF A**

**REGISTERED NURSE (RN) OR A VOCATIONAL NURSE (LVN) LICENSE, AS APPROPRIATE,  
WILL NOT APPLY TO THIS STIPULATION PERIOD:**

(8) PETITIONER SHALL notify all future employers in nursing of this Order of the Board and the stipulations on PETITIONER'S license(s). PETITIONER SHALL present a complete copy of this Order and all Proposals for Decision issued by the Administrative Law Judge, if any, to each future employer prior to accepting an offer of employment.

(9) PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE each future employer to submit the Notification of Employment form, which is provided to the PETITIONER by the Board, to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a nurse.

(10) For the duration of the stipulation period, PETITIONER SHALL be supervised by a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Registered Nurse, or by a Licensed Vocational Nurse or a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse, who is on the premises. The supervising nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as PETITIONER, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention if necessary. The supervising nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience in the same or similar practice setting to which the PETITIONER is currently working. PETITIONER SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). PETITIONER SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. PETITIONER SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.

(11) PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the PETITIONER by the Board, periodic reports as to PETITIONER'S capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the nurse who supervises the PETITIONER. These reports shall be submitted by the supervising nurse to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) month period for two (2) year(s) of employment as a nurse.



IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from PETITIONER'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and PETITIONER may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

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PETITIONER'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Reinstatement Agreed Order. I certify that my past behavior, except as disclosed in my Petition for Reinstatement of Licensure, has been in conformity with the Board's professional character rule. I have provided the Board with complete and accurate documentation of my past behavior in violation of the penal law of any jurisdiction which was disposed of through any procedure short of convictions, such as: conditional discharge, deferred adjudication or dismissal. I have no criminal prosecution pending in any jurisdiction.

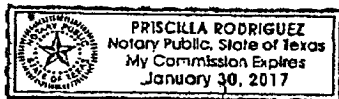

ORDER OF THE BOARD

On this day, the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, accepted the voluntary surrender of Registered Nurse Number 551039 and Vocational Nurse License Number 69863, issued to DIANA SUE BOLIN, hereinafter referred to as Respondent. This action was taken in accordance with Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing.

The Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is currently licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas. Respondent holds a license to practice vocational nursing which is in delinquent status.
2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing.
3. Respondent received a Certificate in Vocational Nursing from St. Philips College Vocational Nursing Program, San Antonio, Texas, on May 27, 1976, and a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, Texas, on December 14, 1988, Respondent was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas in November 19, 1976 and Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on April 4, 1989.
4. Respondent's nursing employment history is unknown.

5. On or about October 22, 2006, Respondent submitted a Texas Online Renewal Document Registered Nurse to the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas, in which she provided false, deceptive, and/or misleading information, in that she answered "No" to the question: "Have you ever been convicted, placed on community supervision whether or not adjudicated guilty, sentenced to serve jail or prison time or granted pre-trial diversion, or received a court order whether or not a sentence was imposed, including any pending criminal charges or unresolved arrests whether or not on appeal (excluding minor Class C traffic violations)? This includes expunged offenses and deferred adjudications with or without a finding of guilt. You may answer "No" if you have previously disclosed a criminal matter otherwise responsive to this question in a renewal and/or licensure form.
- A. On or about December 13, 2004, Respondent was arrested by the Dimmit County Sheriff's Office, Carrizo Springs, Texas, for CRIMINAL TRESPASS (a Class B misdemeanor offense). On or about February 21, 2005, the Prosecutor rejected the charge without a pre-trial diversion.
6. On or about October 8, 2008, Respondent submitted a License Renewal Form to the Texas Board of Nursing in which you answered "Yes" to the question: Have you, within the past 24 months or since your last renewal, for any criminal offense, including those pending appeal:
- A. been convicted of a misdemeanor?
  - B. been convicted of a felony?
  - C. pled nolo contendere, no contest, or guilty?
  - D. received deferred adjudication?
  - E. been placed on community supervision or court-ordered probation, whether or not adjudicated guilty?
  - F. been sentenced to serve jail or prison time? court-ordered confinement?
  - G. been granted pre-trial diversion?
  - H. been arrested or have any pending criminal charges?
  - I. been cited or charged with any violation of the law?
  - J. been subject of a court-martial; Article 15 violation; or received any form of military judgement/punishment/action?"

Respondent disclosed that on or about September 28, 2007, Respondent was arrested by the Office of Investigations, Eagle Pass, Eagle Pass, Texas, for SMUGGLING ALIENS.

7. In response to Findings of Fact Number six (6), Respondent states she was going to work and was stopped by federal agents and detained. Respondent was released on a personal recognizance bond for Conspiracy To Transport Illegal Aliens, charges pending. Respondent has been reporting to United States Pretrial Services and has turned her life around to focus on her job and family.

8. On June 30, 2009 Respondent returned License Number 551039 and submitted a notarized statement to the Board voluntarily surrendering the right to practice nursing in Texas. A copy of the statement dated June 30, 2009, is attached and incorporated, by reference herein, as part of this Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(6)(I)&(13).
4. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
5. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
6. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.452 (b), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TAC §§213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

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ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the voluntary surrender of Registered Nurse Number 551039, and Vocational Nurse License Number 69863, heretofore issued to DIANA SUE BOLIN, to practice nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice nursing, use the title of Registered Nurse or Vocational Nurse, or the abbreviation "RN" or "LVN" or wear any insignia identifying herself as a nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a Registered Nurse or Vocational Nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until: one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in compact states.

Dear Board of Nurse Examiners

I ask that you accept my written request to volunteer my RN Compact License #551039 Diana Sue Bolin, as I will be voluntarily surrendering myself to federal prison as of June 30, 2009. Been sentenced for conspiracy of knowing about people hauling illegal people. I have not done anything to jeopardize the safety and well being of any patients/clients that I have worked with in my nursing profession. 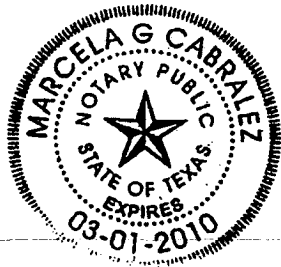


