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ORDER MODIFICATION

A public meeting of the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee of the Board, hereinafter referred to as the Committee, was held on December 8, 2015, at 333 Guadalupe, Tower 3, Suite 460, Austin, Texas, to consider the Petition for Exception and supporting documents filed by SHAROL A. BURNETT, hereinafter referred to as PETITIONER.

PETITIONER appeared in person.

Board Members in attendance were: Deborah Hughes Bell, CLU, ChFC; Beverly Jean Nutall, LVN; and Kathy Shipp, MSN, RN, FNP. Staff present were: James W. Johnston, General Counsel; Kristen Benton, MSN, RN, Director of Nursing; Anthony L. Diggs, Director, Enforcement Division; John DeLaRosa, Program Specialist; Kathy Hoffman, Legal Assistant Supervisor; Diane E. Burell, Compliance Supervisor; and Jody McFarland, MSN, RN, Nursing Practice Consultant.

After review and due consideration of the filed Petition, the Committee voted to modify the Agreed Order entered on November 9, 2010, to permit the Petitioner to be supervised by a physician. Therefore, Petitioner is required to comply with and complete all of the requirements of the November 9, 2010, Agreed Order, except that Stipulations Numbered Seven (7) and Eight (8) are modified as follows:





(7) For the remainder of the stipulation period, RESPONDENT SHALL be supervised by a physician or a Registered Nurse who is on the premises. The supervising physician or nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as RESPONDENT, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention if necessary. The supervising physician or nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience in the same or similar setting to which the RESPONDENT is currently working. RESPONDENT SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined units(s). RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.

(8) RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the Respondent by the Board, periodic reports as to RESPONDENT's capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the physician or nurse who supervised the RESPONDENT. These reports shall be submitted by the supervising physician or nurse to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) months for one (1) year of employment as a nurse.

PETITIONER is responsible for completing all remaining requirements of the November 9, 2010, Agreed Order as written.
