ORDER OF THE BOARD

On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of AYESHA KAI RAZEEQ, Registered Nurse License Number 891966, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

This action was taken in accordance with Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Order.

The Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in delinquent status.

2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from ATS Institute of Technology, Highland Heights, Ohio, on December 7, 2012. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on January 20, 2016.
4. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

5. At the time of the initial incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Heritage Oaks Residence and Rehabilitation Center, Arlington, Texas, and had been in that position for three (3) weeks.
6. On or about December 30, 2016, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Heritage Oaks Residence and Rehabilitation Center, Arlington, Texas, and caring for Resident S.I., Respondent failed to timely activate Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and/or ensure emergent transfer of the resident to a hospital after the resident had an unwitnessed fall. The resident was on a prescribed anticoagulant regimen, which increased the resident's risk for bleeding, and Respondent noted a hematoma to the resident's forehead after the fall. Subsequently, the resident's transport to a hospital was delayed by more than two (2) hours. The resident was diagnosed with a subdural hematoma and later expired. Respondent's conduct deprived the resident of the benefit of emergent medical interventions, and may have contributed to the resident's demise.
7. On or about December 30, 2016, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Heritage Oaks Residence and Rehabilitation Center, Arlington, Texas, and caring for the aforementioned Resident S.I., Respondent inappropriately administered 50 mg of tramadol, a pain medication, to the resident after the resident had an unwitnessed fall, despite the fact that 15 mg of morphine, a narcotic pain medication, had been administered to the resident approximately thirty (30) minutes prior. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the resident in that the combination of medications administered can alter mentation, causing signs of intracranial hemorrhage, such as severe headache and changes in level of consciousness, to go undetected.
8. On or about December 30, 2016, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Heritage Oaks Residence and Rehabilitation Center, Arlington, Texas, and caring for the aforementioned Resident S.I., Respondent failed to perform required neurologic assessments after the resident had an unwitnessed fall. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the resident in that changes in mental status, which may have been indicative of intracranial hemorrhage, may have gone undetected.
9. In response to the incidents in Findings of Fact Numbers Seven (7) through Nine (9), Respondent admits the patient was prescribed an anticoagulant regimen that had been in

effect since at least September 2016 which placed the patient at a higher risk of bleeding. Respondent states she noted a hematoma to the patient's left lateral temple. Respondent states it is not clear whether there was a delay in transport to a higher level of care, but there was an interval of about two (2) hours between when Respondent discovered the patient and the physician's order to transfer the patient to the hospital. Respondent states the patient did not present with a change in neurological status during the time she attempted to contact the provider, family, and facility leadership. Respondent states there is no documentation in the record to indicate the situation called for emergency services. Respondent admits she administered oral tramadol in response to the patient's verbal complaints of pain at the time of her fall. Respondent states although there would be caution in administering an additional narcotic after a patient fall, under the circumstances it was routine for this patient, and not inappropriate. Respondent states her notes indicate she evaluated the patient's neurological status at regular intervals of approximately fifteen (15) minutes while physically attending to the patient after the fall and awaiting a response from the attending physician. Respondent states apart from the direct assessment of the patient immediately after she was discovered, and until the physician returned Respondent's call two (2) hours later, Respondent performed informal neurological assessments.

10. Formal Charges were filed on May 5, 2017.
11. Formal Charges were mailed to Respondent on May 8, 2017.
12. On February 15, 2018, the Board received a statement from Respondent voluntarily surrendering the right to practice nursing in Texas. A copy of Respondent's statement, dated February 15, 2018, is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(C)&(1)(M), and 217.12(1)(A),(1)(B)&(4).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 891966, heretofore issued to AYESHA KAIRAZEEQ, including revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
5. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.

6. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, as amended, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
7. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

TERMS OF ORDER


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the **VOLUNTARY SURRENDER** of Registered Nurse License Number 891966, heretofore issued to AYESHA KAIRAZEEQ, to practice nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice professional/registered nursing, use the title "registered nurse" or the abbreviation "RN" or wear any insignia identifying herself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until at least one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
