On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of ONESIMO PANALEZ FLORES, Vocational Nurse License Number 197682, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may have violated Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived an informal conference, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on April 26, 2007, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, Executive Director.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license.
2. Respondent waived an informal conference, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.
4. Respondent received a Certificate in Vocational Nursing from Southwest Texas Junior College, Uvalde, Texas, on May 15, 2004. Respondent was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas on February 22, 2005.
5. Respondent's complete vocational nursing employment history is unknown.
6. On or about December 3, 2004, Respondent submitted an Application by NCLEX-PN Examination for Licensed Vocational Nurses to the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas, in which he provided false, deceptive, and/or misleading information, in that he answered "No" to the question:

"Have you been convicted, adjudged guilty by a court, no contest or nolo contendere to any crime...including pending criminal charges or unresolved arrests...." Respondent failed to disclose the following offenses:

- A. On or about May 22, 1998, Respondent entered a plea of Guilty and was convicted of DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED (a Class B misdemeanor offense committed on June 8, 1997), in the County Court at Law, Walker County, Texas, under Cause No. 97-905. As a result of the conviction, Respondent was sentenced to confinement in the Walker County Jail for a period of ninety (90) days, however, the imposition of the sentence of confinement was suspended, and Respondent was placed on probation for a period of one (1) year. In addition, Respondent was ordered to pay a fine and court costs.
  - B. On or about February 1999, Respondent received a deferred adjudication on the charge of PUBLIC INTOXICATION (a Class C misdemeanor offense). The proceedings against Respondent were deferred without entering an adjudication of guilt, and Respondent was placed on probation for a period of ninety (90) days. Additionally, he was ordered to pay a fine and court costs.
  - C. On or about May 14, 2001, Respondent entered a plea agreement to reduce the charge of DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED - 2nd (a Class A misdemeanor offense committed on April 30, 2001) to a lesser charge by entering a plea of Guilty to RECKLESS DRIVING (a Class B misdemeanor offense), in the County Court of Frio County, Texas, under Cause No. 17837. Respondent was ordered to pay a fine and court costs.
7. On or about October 22, 2006, Respondent submitted a written statement related to Finding of Fact number Six (6), in which he stated "I did not disclose my past criminal history because I read a document that stated any convictions more than three years old do not have to be disclosed and can answer no to question number two. My intention was never to be dishonest with the BNE. I called several months ago and spoke with a representative of the BNE and I was informed to disclose my past criminal history during my renewal of my license, send the court documents and an explanation of what happened in each incident and why I did not inform the BNE.
8. Formal Charges were filed on September 28, 2007.
9. Formal Charges were mailed to Respondent on October 1, 2007.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555 , the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(6)(I).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Vocational Nurse License Number 197682, heretofore issued to ONESIMO PANALEZ FLORES, including revocation of Respondent's license to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of REMEDIAL EDUCATION WITH A FINE, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended, Texas Occupations Code §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Vocational Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.01 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license is encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL deliver the wallet-sized license issued to ONESIMO PANALEZ FLORES to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing within ten (10) days of the date of ratification of this Order for appropriate notation.

(2) RESPONDENT SHALL pay a monetary fine in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). RESPONDENT SHALL pay this fine within forty-five (45) days of entry of this Order. Payment is to be made directly to the Texas Board of Nursing in the form of cashier's check or U.S. money order. Partial payments will not be accepted.

(3) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) contact hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify RESPONDENT's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address:*

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL be issued an unencumbered license and multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

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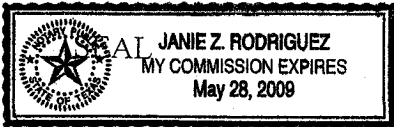
RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION


